



Liberty STEAM Charter News from the Nest Week of Aug 30–Sept 3




Welcome to a new week at the Eagle's Nest! Can you believe we are beginning our 4th week?...and our 2nd week of curriculum instruction following our 2 weeks of Culture Camp? Time really flies when there are great things happening. This week, we will take a look at ways to promote literacy in the home as a support to our scholars' EL curriculum. Encouraging scholars to read-anything from street signs, to books, to captions on their favorite movies/YouTube shows-will aid in improving literacy skills and encourage scholars to develop a relationship with words that help promote their communication skills. Check out some of the ways below that promote scholars' interest in reading:

- Play word games-Name a word and ask your scholar to list as many words as they can that rhyme with that word
- Turn ON the captions-Having the captions on while watching videos/movies/television shows will allow scholars to connect the spoken words with the written words increasing their ability to identify them by sight
- Take advantage of the public library system and the various opportunities that exist through connecting with them including Dial-a-story, BookFlix, and Literacy Kits (Information for BookFlix and Literacy Kits are attached)
 - Dial-a-story allows you to call a designated phone number into a local library system to hear a story read aloud; stories are offered in English and Spanish at age appropriate levels
