

RE: FERPA Notification for the 2025-26 School Year

Dear VIP (Very Important Parent/Guardian):

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) allows schools to release "directory information" i.e, scholar's name, address, photograph, participation in officially recognized activities and sports, diploma or certificate, awards received, and other similar information. LSC considers photographs to include digital images, including digital photographs and recordings related to school or school-sponsored events, activities, and special recognition, as "directory information." In additional, federal laws require schools to provide military recruiters, upon request, with three directory information categories—names, addresses, and telephone listings—unless parents have advised the school that they do not want their scholar's information to be disclosed.

During the course of your child's educational career at LSC, he or she will participate in a variety of academic, fine arts, and other events and activities in which he or she may be photographed or interviewed by school staff or news media. We proudly share the LSC story in a variety of ways. Information about your child may appear in newspaper articles, on television, in radio broadcasts, on displays, on the website, on social media, or in school promotional pieces (yearbooks, awards programs, newsletters, etc.). The release of "directory information" allows us to publicize your scholar's accomplishments.

Please note that individual scholar records, including scholastic information, standardized test data, health records, and other similar information <u>are not</u> available public inspection. This information is only available to scholar's parents/guardians or to the student of legal age.

If you object to the release of this information, please notify me in writing at 117 North Main Street, Sumter, SC 29150, no later than August 13, 2025. If you do not submit a written objection, the school will be able to release this information as appropriate.

The use of any "directory information" by Liberty STEAM Charter is for the promotion of our scholars and the school. Communicating About Student Learning

Scholar Eagle NEST Binders

Every week, all scholars take work binders with lessons and skills they will be working on in the coming week. For example, work binders may include a list of sight words, sample math problems to master, and notes about fun and engaging science experiments. Whether it's pumpkin painting, popcorn tasting, or creating a volcano using root beer and yogurt, teachers provide information on what families can expect. Homework is given on Mondays via the NEST binders as a menu board for scholars to work through over the week and submit on Thursdays.

Newsletters

LSC shares two newsletters with families regularly to communicate specific scholar learning and also to highlight important upcoming events at the school. Each Sunday, Parent Weekly is sent out electronically via the school-wide One Call Text text message portal and Class Dojo. A wealth of information is included here, including announcements, updates, successes, deadlines, and snapshots of scholars reading, learning, and presenting. Weekly copies of this newsletter are housed on the Primary or Elementary Academy tab of the website. Once a quarter, a school-wide community newsletter is sent out via email, reflecting on the past month and looking ahead to upcoming exciting events.

Class Dojo & One Call Now

All teachers utilize Class Dojo to share class news and updates, individual scholar academic performance, behavior charts, and video clips of new lessons. Families also have access to electronic anchor charts, allowing them to use the same instructional resources to reinforce learning at home. Lastly, all parents have the ability to receive a daily text message from the school that includes a question of the day, the cafe menus, and important announcements through the One Call Now text message portal.

All parents who are listed as the scholar's primary guardians in PowerSchool are automatically enrolled in the One Call Now platform.

Social Media: Facebook, Instagram, LinkedIn, YouTube, TikTok, & Twitter

LSC maintains a robust presence on all six major social media platforms —Facebook, Instagram, LinkedIn, YouTube, TikTok, and Twitter —and commands an impressive combined following of 5,000 individuals. LSC believes in this powerful approach in helping to share its story with the general public. At a minimum, there are three posts made each day that could include scholar learning being featured, video message updates, and culture celebration shout-outs that reinforce the core values for which we stand as a learning community.

Community Culture Celebrations

Staff and scholars are explicitly taught to demonstrate the three Eagle Core values every day - Stand up and Own It, Power of Team, and Growth Mindset. Each day, three scholars from the classroom are recognized with S.O.A.R. Tokens - one for each core value. During the weekly Community Culture Celebration, each grade level comes together for a "pep rally"- style event to recognize special scholars who have gone above and beyond in demonstrating the S.O.A.R. values. Families are invited to participate in the celebration both in person and virtually through our social media platforms. Doing this reinforces and incentivizes the type of character we believe makes a well-rounded scholar capable of tackling the challenges of the 21st century.

Websites at Home

All scholars have access to Amira and IXL through their Clever Badge, even when away from school, using their classroom login accounts. At the beginning of each year, scholars' login information is sent home in the Eagle Nest Binder.



2025-26 Primary Academy Parent FAQ

#	Question	Answer
1	What time does my scholar get dropped off on Monday-Friday?	7:30-8:00 AM with staff supervision available. After 8 am, scholars must be walked in with an adult. Scholars are considered tardy at 8:05 am and must be signed in by an adult.
2	What time is scholar pick up on Monday-Thursday?	The expectation is that scholars are picked up between 3:10-3:30 pm. Any pickups after 3:40 pm are considered a late pickup. If a scholar is picked up late more than 3 times, the family may be called in for a conference and the scholar will be placed on an attendance plan.
3	What time do scholars get dismissed on Friday?	11:50 AM -12:10 PM Scholars are late dismissal at 12:11 PM. Scholars with excessive late pick ups will be addressed on a case-by-case basis by school administration.
4	Will there be an early release cut off time at the primary academy?	If you plan to pick up your scholar early from school you must get them before 2:15. For the safety of our scholars, and to ensure a smooth transition to dismissal, no scholar will be dismissed after 2:15.
5	What is the educational model?	For the purposes of consistency across campuses, every scholar begins their day with a 30 minute Social Emotional Learning (SEL) lesson. For literacy, we believe in an approach that is based on the science of reading that infuses foundational literacy practices, reading comprehension, and volume of reading. To accomplish our vision, we use the knowledge building curriculum HMH Into Reading and Writing Program, Daily Small Group Phonics/Reading Lessons, Phonemic Awareness Instruction, Independent Reading time, Modeled writing, and computer-based programs (RAZ Kids, IXL, Epic Books, etc.) For math, we believe excellent mathematics instruction reinforces the shifts in mathematical practices by balancing scholars' conceptual understanding of mathematical principles with application and fluency practice. To accomplish that vision, we have chosen the Eureka mathematics curriculum in addition to the IXL online system.
6	Is early care offered?	Yes. We are committed to offering early drop off for families who need it beginning at 6:00AM for a monthly fee. Contact Mrs. Billups for more information (cbillups@libertysteamcharter.org). Sign up using this link: https://shorturl.at/ZlfEU
7	Is HYPE after-school program being offered?	As far as we know, yes. We are open to any daycare who offers to pick up scholars at the request of their parents. Remember, HYPE (limited scholarship slots available) is not operated physically on LSC campuses but we receive a certain number of spots on a first come, first serve basis. A 2nd option for the after-school program that is not operated physically on LSC campuses is YMCA (limited scholarship slots available). Interested parents may complete the application on our website and drop off to the YMCA in person. Both HYPE & YMCA will follow the same schedule. Both HYPE & YMCA provide transportation for scholars. Please reach out to the YMCA or HYPE directly to

		sign-up. Visit the HYPE office to talk with Mr. Gadson at 415 Manning Avenue or by phone (803-934-9527). You can sign up with the YMCA at their facility on Miller Road.
8	How are school meals served?	All food is prepared at the Primary Academy campus. For the 25-26 school year, all scholars will receive breakfast & lunch at no charge!
9	Has the staff been hired yet?	We are 100% fully staffed!
10	Will there be a School Resource Officer at the Primary Academy? How safe is the school?	We are committed to ensuring the safety of our scholars. Yes, LSC has a full-time SRO assigned to the Primary Academy Campus (Deputy Horton). LSC's Primary Academy has an additional security gate installed that provides a horizontal barrier to prevent access from the back half of the campus during school hours. LSC enjoys a state of the art video security system with a double locked entry door/buzz-in system.
11	Is there an outdoor play area?	Our scholars enjoy a large playground area for recess and two grassy fields that will be utilized for physical education classes.
12	How do report cards look at this Academy?	We use a standards based grading scale for all grades on report cards. Scholars are introduced to material through a variety of methods of instruction, given time to practice the skill throughout the quarter, and then assessed for mastery at the end of the nine weeks. Scholars will earn 1 (Beginning), 2 (Developing), 3 (Mastery), or 4 (Advanced) in each assessed area. LSC uses traditional four quarter marking periods that are between 45 and 49 days each.
13	Will my scholar take state standardized tests?	All kindergarten scholars take the SC Kindergarten Readiness Assessment that is a one-on-one teacher administered assessment during the first 45 days of school. You can expect to receive a detailed score report at the end of the second quarter. All kindergarten and first grade scholars will complete MAP testing 3x (Fall, Winter, and Spring). Classroom teachers will use progress monitoring tools to identify scholars that need additional intervention.
14	What is the uniform policy for this Academy?	Check out our board approved uniform policy for both campuses on our website here . Uniform checks are conducted each day by 8:30 am. Parents of scholars who are in violation of the uniform policy will be contacted by 8:45 am for a change of clothes.
15	Will the Book Mobile continue to visit the PA campus?	Yes, we are excited to continue our unique partnership with the Sumter County Library.
16	Do you practice emergency drills at this campus?	Absolutely! We conduct all state-required, monthly drills, including: Fire, Active Shooter (Lockdown/Lockout), Tornado, and Earthquake.
17	Does this Academy offer extra academic services?	Yes, the Primary Academy offers academic intervention, academic enrichment (potential GT), resource, speech, OT, and PT to all scholars who qualify. We will also offer after-school tutoring to scholars who are not already receiving intervention services during the regular school day.
18	Are there two teachers in every classroom at this Academy?	Yes! We are committed to keeping our co-teaching model in all kindergarten and first grade homeroom classes.
19	How many scholars are in each homeroom?	25 is the maximum class size, which provides a 13:1 student to teacher ratio, given our co-teaching model, and will be maintained all year at 25 throughout the year by filling any vacant seats from the enrollment lottery waitlist.

20	What will gifted education look like?	Scholars will be identified through their fall MAP testing percentiles to receive academic enrichment instruction with Ms. Hray (pull out services). Each semester the roster will be reviewed based on new assessment information from winter MAP testing. The percentile criteria will be determined by the number of scholars who test and the available slots.
21	Will tutoring be offered?	We intend to continue our current format of tutoring services for scholars identified through assessment data at a minimum of two days a week.
22	What will enrichments look like?	We are committed to teaching the whole child through a flex rotation schedule. Your scholar will continue to have 2 enrichments a day and experience a total of three different enrichments each week: PE, Spanish, and STEAM Project Lead the Way. STEAM Project Lead the Way is built off of four modules to reflect Sumter's greatest economic needs - industrial technology, engineering technology, business technology, & health sciences. Scholars will have a flex schedule, which means sometimes, they will have the same enrichment twice in one week, but once in alternating weeks.
23	What SEL support is offered?	LSC's educational model places a high priority on social-emotional learning (SEL). To ensure that scholars develop these important skills, the first 30 minutes of each day are dedicated to a morning meeting. This meeting follows the Fly Five SEL curriculum, which focuses on five key competencies: cooperation, assertiveness, responsibility, empathy, and self-control (C.A.R.E.S). At the beginning and end of the school year, scholars participate in an SEL assessment to measure their SEL performance. This assessment evaluates scholars' performance levels using ranges such as above average, at or around average, below average, and well below average. The assessment also measures scholars' competencies in four categories: emotion recognition, social perspective-taking, social problem-solving, and self-control. If scholars are identified as needing additional support in SEL, the team may recommend various programs. These include the Eagles Take Flight community mentoring program, which provides personalized guidance and support. Another option is the daily check-in/check-out program (CICO), which helps scholars monitor and manage their behavior. Additionally, weekly SEL small groups provide a supportive environment for scholars to work on their social-emotional skills. It is important to note that SEL is not limited to individual scholars but is a school-wide focus. To celebrate the commitment to SEL, schools hold Community Culture Celebrations (CCC) on Fridays, where the achievements and progress made in this area are recognized and celebrated by the entire school community.
24	What will parent communication look like at the PA campus?	Parent Weekly (email, dojo) Dojo (classroom and school-wide) One Call (VIPs are automatically enrolled).
25	What are Community Culture Celebrations?	Community Culture Celebrations are school-wide "pep-rallies" held for each grade level on Fridays. During this exciting ceremony, we positively incentivize desired scholar behaviors, while giving each class an opportunity to show their school spirit by participating in class chants, school-wide cheers, and reviewing LSC's S.O.A.R. (Show Respect, Obey Rules, Accept Responsibility, Rise to Excellence) core values. Scholars are recognized for their demonstration of these strong characteristics and their peers and family celebrate them for making responsible choices and being good citizens. To make this occasion even more special, we invite you to share brief remarks during the event. For

		example, you could say: "We are so proud of your hard work and cannot wait to see how much you grow this year". In order to accommodate all attendees comfortably, we kindly request that each scholar have no more than (2) in-person guests. Small babies & children are not counted as guests. Please be aware that any additional guests will be asked to leave. All guests will be required to present identification and sign in upon arrival. As we want everyone to be a part of this special moment, the celebration will also be live-streamed on our LSC Facebook page. We kindly ask that you refrain from bringing celebratory items such as balloons, flowers, or gift bags. Please plan to arrive at the school no later than 8:20 am (Kindergarten) to check in with the office staff and get settled. The Kindergarten celebration will begin promptly at 8:30 am and will last approximately an hour. Please plan to arrive at the school no later than 9:50 AM (1st grade) to check in with the office staff and get settled. The 1st grade celebration will begin promptly at 10:00 am and last approximately an hour. Staff will reach out to families via Dojo message to inform. We ask that families reply promptly to the message to confirm family attendance.
26	Are there any opportunities for scholars to dress out of uniform?	Yes! We have several "Dress Down" themed weeks throughout the year. This information is sent home several weeks before so parents and scholars can be ready! In addition, EVERY Friday, scholars are able to show their individual personality by dressing out of uniform.
27	What is the leadership structure at LSC?	While we have some elements of the traditional public school leadership structure, including LeAndrea Montgomery, Academy Director (Principal), Rashyra Smiling (Instructional Coach), Emeral Franklin, (Cultural Interventionist), Valerie Smith (Teacherprenuer), Nicky Pack (Special Populations Coordinator), and Eunisha Sweeney (Front Office Coordinator/Leader Fellow), we also have several other members of the administration team that are network based or work with both the primary and elementary academy. In addition, we utilize collective leadership, where teachers and coaches work toward shared goals and share decision making. For example, Mrs. Smith will be in a hybrid leadership role this year to both serve intervention scholars & coach teachers on best practices.
28	When will I know my scholar's teacher assignments? Can I make a request?	A welcome back postcard will be mailed to all scholars on July 26 from their assigned co-teachers. Look for it to arrive by July 29. The back-to-school extravaganza is scheduled for July 30! Since all of our teachers are amazing and work hard to build strong relationships with scholars, we are confident that your scholar will be in great hands. Classes are balanced based on many factors, so we do not honor specific teacher requests.
29	Will scholars use any technology?	Absolutely! Each classroom uses small group instruction for up to 2 hours a day (one hour for reading and one hour for math) on Monday through Thursday. During the small group rotations, scholars have the opportunity to utilize technology for education based activities. School subscriptions for scholars support the curriculum and include Raz-Kids Plus and IXL for reading and math. Additionally, our new reading curriculum uses Amira to support individualized instruction in reading fluency. Teachers also use additional learning platforms such as Teach Your Monster to Read, Freckle, Prodigy, etc. Chrome books will not go home.
30	When will we find out who our scholars' teachers are?	Our teachers return from Summer break in mid July. Teachers will receive their rosters and mail out all welcome back postcards to their scholars on July 26. Our Nest Fest will be July 30th from 9am-12 pm. We can't wait to host you at the Primary Academy.

All back to school information will be shared on social media but also kept on the home page of the LSC website. - 2. Ensure all parents/families have a clear understanding of state academic standards, academic assessments, how to monitor their scholar's progress, and how to work with LSC teachers to improve their scholar's achievements;
- 3. Provide materials and training to help parents/families work with their scholars, such as literacy and technology training;
- 4. Provide meaningful opportunities for parent/family-teacher consultations.

Parent & Family Engagement Evaluation

Each year, LSC will evaluate our *Parent & Family Engagement Policy* content and effectiveness and all related activities to improve the academic quality of Title I schools. In addition to the bimonthly Possip feedback survey, LSC commits to collecting formal feedback from parents regarding their level of satisfaction regarding parent & family engagement at three checkpoints in the year: August, December, and May. These formal surveys will be administered electronically. We will post these surveys on our website, social media, and other communication platforms (Dojo, Remind, etc).

Our Uniform Philosophy

At Liberty STEAM Charter School (LSC), we ground ourselves foundationally in equity for all scholars to ensure transformational learning outcomes. This will leave our scholars ready to enter the world with integrity, love, and a true sense of excellence. LSC has instituted a uniform dress code for all scholars to create a consistent and safe environment free of distractions. We believe that a higher standard of dress encourages greater respect for individuals, scholars & others and results in a higher standard of behavior. Scholars who come to school dressed properly will excel academically and conduct themselves appropriately while at school. This belief is supported by research into the benefits of uniforms. However, conventional wisdom suggests that mandatory uniform policies benefit scholars on specific behavioral issues (attendance and self-control) and academic outcomes. Uniform policies also affect school environments and student outcomes by providing a visible and public symbol of commitment to school improvement and reform. Our goal is to offer a cost-effective uniform that gives all scholars equal access to school pride, regardless of family income level. The standard LSC uniform is:

Primary Academy

• A heather gray, navy blue or white LSC polo shirt (short-or long-sleeve) to be worn with khaki or navy blue pants, jumper, skirt, or shorts or a navy blue polo dress. Polo shirts without the LSC logo on it are not allowed.

Elementary Academy

• A heather gray, navy blue or white LSC polo shirt (short-or long-sleeve) to be worn with khaki or navy blue pants, jumper, skirt, or shorts or a navy blue polo dress. Polo shirts without the LSC logo on it are not allowed.

All scholars:

- Pants with loops are to be worn with a black or brown belt
- White, black, navy blue or gray tights/socks (no identifiable sock logos of any kind)
- White or black undershirt (short or long sleeve)
- The black, gray or navy blue school jacket, crew sweatshirt, or hoodie with the LSC logo is optional but recommended for the cooler months
- Uniform shoes can be any color but must be rubber soled and appropriate for physical education but cannot be sliders, sandals, crocs or flip flops.
- Boots that help with traction for safe walking can only be worn during inclement (snow or ice) weather days. Fashionable boots, belts, eyeglasses, etc., are never permitted. Jackets, hoodies and un-logo sweaters of any sort are not allowed to be worn in the classroom but can be worn from the outside coming in with the same solid shirt colors and no design larger than the LSC logo size.

At the primary academy level, we recognize that scholars rely heavily on their parents to ensure they are dressed appropriately. **A** daily uniform check will be conducted by the academy campus culture team. Parents of scholars not in compliance will be contacted via phone/letter. Remember, as part of the Commitment to Excellence signed upon confirmation of your scholar's enrollment, you committed to partner with the school to ensure uniform expectations are met. Any family needing financial assistance to ensure these expectations are met should contact the academy academy counselor.

FRIDAYS: Every Friday at LSC is an early release day for staff professional development. On these days, scholars are encouraged to express their individuality by "dressing down" that adheres to the non-uniform dress code policy adopted by the LSC Board. LSC specialized shirts can only be worn on these days.
